In this workshop, we will present the link between marketing and service quality. The participants will learn to correlate the two concepts and how to use them in their companies or personal projects.

Prof. Dr. Erika Galindo Bello holds a Doctorate in Economics and Social Sciences with a specialization on International Marketing from Johannes Kepler University, Austria. She holds a master's degree in International Business and Marketing and a bachelor's degree in business administration from UDLAP. She was in charge of Center for Business Outreach for 8 years, initiating collaboration agreements with around 500 internationally recognized companies thus forming a solid portfolio of business collaboration. Her research fields are export strategies and consumer behavior.

Francisco Gabriel Rodríguez González is an associate professor at Universidad de las Americas Puebla in Mexico. He holds a Ph.D. in business administration from EGADE Business School, Mexico City, where he specialized in operations management and continuous improvement. He also holds an MBA from EGADE Business School, Mexico City, with a concentration in strategy, and a bachelor's degree in business administration from the Universidad del Valle de Mexico, Tlalpan. Dr. Rodríguez's professional experience includes more than 13 years working as a business consultant in public and private organizations. His research interests focus on process improvement, eco-efficiency, and eco-innovation, as well as corporate sustainability. He has authored and coauthored several scientific publications, including book chapters and an entry in the SAGE Encyclopedia of Quality and the Service Economy. He was part of the team that won the European Foundation for Management Development (EFMD) Case Writing Competition 2017, in the "Continuous Improvement: The Journey to Excellence" category. Dr. Rodríguez is member of Beta Gamma Sigma.

CONTENT

This workshop will introduce you to Augmented Reality as a tool to create art and promote your art to millions of people. You will create your own Face Filter for Snapchat by exploring the possibilities of the human face as a canvas. No prior knowledge of the program is needed. Any skill, from physical painting to 3D sculpting, can be harnessed and turned into an Augmented Reality experience. With the constant improvement in quality of the mostly free AR programs, the potential on how to present your work in a digital, accessible and personal way has only begun.

Born in Germany in 1990, **Sarah Mayer** completed her Bachelor in Fashion and Design in 2015 in Amsterdam. During her studies, she interned for the renowned Belgian Fashion Designer, Walter Van Beirendonck (Member of the Antwerp Six) in 2013 and won the Lectra Award for her Hyper Craft collection (digital fashion minor) in 2014. Her work is further influenced by her experience on film sets.

For the past three years (2019–2022), Sarah has shifted her focus entirely towards the Digital World. Her digital masks, partly available as Augmented Reality experiences (on Instagram, Snapchat and Tiktok), keep fashion at its core while not aiming to be fashionable. Instead, the designs question what fashion can become with a different medium.

Diskurse zur Auseinandersetzung um ethnisch-kulturelle Vielfalt, Identität einer mehrsprachigen und -kulturellen Gesellschaft sowie Umgang mit Minderheiten erfolgen sehr heterogen. Für die Studierenden sind Mehrsprachigkeit und Mehrkulturalität reflektierende Texte, Bücher, Filme relevant, da sie ihr persönliches Lebensgefühl, ihre Identität wie die gesellschaftliche Lebenswelt widerspiegeln. Prof. Dr. habil. Canan Şenöz-Ayata studierte Germanistik an der Istanbul Universität und kam 1994–1995 mit einem Jahresstipendium des DAAD an die Universität Bielefeld. Sie promovierte 1999 mit einer Dissertation zur Textsorte Literaturkritik im Deutschen und im Türkischen. 2006 erfolgte in Istanbul die Habilitation zur Forschung der Textlinguistik-Texte in der Türkei. Seit 2014 ist sie als Professorin an der Germanistikabteilung der Universität Istanbul tätig. Sie kam 2019–2020 im Rahmen des DAAD-Austauschprogramms als Gastprofessorin an die HSBI, um im Fachbereich Sozialwesen Seminare über Interkulturalität und Mehrsprachigkeit zu erteilen. Zu ihren Arbeitsschwerpunkten gehören allgemeine Linguistik, kontrastive Linguistik, Textlinguistik, Wissenschaftskommunikation, Mehrsprachigkeit und interkulturelle Studien.

Metamorphosis is a 2-day design workshop led by typographer and design thinker Prof. Oded Ezer. Participants will explore the theme of transformation through Ezer's unique design methodology and techniques. Engaging in hands-on tasks and collaborative work, participants will learn to push the boundaries of traditional design. The workshop will culminate in a final outcome that reflects the participants' unique interpretations of metamorphosis.

Oded Ezer is a Tel Aviv-based typographic pioneer, design thinker and professor for graphic design at the Holon Institute of Technology (HIT), who creates visual content and commentary around subjects such as science, anthropology, body-modification, ethics, fiction, religion, politics and writing systems, for cultural and commercial bodies such as Google, Samsung, Waze, NY MoMA, V&A Museum, Jerusalem Season of Culture, and many others.

CONTENT

Lyric videos are animated music videos that showcase the words of a song, animated in time to the music. They all include type and typography in some form, often in innovative ways. During the workshop you are required to make a typographic lyric video for a song that you will pick from a hat. You should interpret the words, mood, type of song in any way that you feel, but with a need to communicate the words. It's not required to make the whole video in the time given, more of an approach (pitch) that communicates your idea.

Fraser Muggeridge is a graphic designer based in London. Throughout a wide range of formats, from artists' books and exhibition catalogues to posters, marketing material, exhibitions, websites, film titles and music, the studio prioritises artists' and writers' content over the imposition of a signature style. Besides, Muggeridge is also a founder and tutor at Typography Summer School, a week-long programme of typographic study for recent graduates and professionals, held in London and New York. Additionally he is a visiting lecturer at The University of Reading and visiting professor at Iceland University of the Arts, Reykjavík.

The IVAC project "Future Engineers – International, Global and Multicultural Formation" consisted of international student collaboration and product development between UDLAP and HSBI. Together, German and Mexican students developed a spirometer (positive pressure breathing device) in order to measure lung capacity. A second generation of German and Mexican students developed a device in order to improve visibility and security of light vehicle traffic participants.

Dr. José Luis Vázquez González has been a full-time professor at the University of the Americas Puebla, Mexico since 1998. He currently heads the department of Computing, Electronics and Mechatronics. His areas of interest are Industrial Automation, Mechatronic Design and Model-Based Simulation. Dr. Vázquez works in the investigation of the impact of technologies in the construction of a platform to support the development of intelligent factories and especially the tools and skills that new generations of students must acquire for the jobs that will be available in the future.

Prof. Dr. Rubén Alejos Palomares received his Ph.D. at the National Institute of Astrophysics, Optics and Electronics at Tonantzintla, Puebla, México. Since 1988 Dr. Alejos has been with the Department of Electrical Engineering of the Universidad de las Américas-Puebla as full-time professor. His areas of interest are instrumentation, measurement, intelligent control systems. Currently he is working in Mechatronics Systems oriented to develop intelligent and autonomous prostheses and in design of biomedical instruments. He is an active member in IEEE and during the period of 2008 to 2010, was the president of the IEEE Puebla Section. Since 2010, he has been Chair of the IEEE Computational Intelligent Society Chapter of the IEEE Puebla Section.

The author argues that reading literacy is a crucial component of media literacy, which is essential for competent participation in the digital world. The presentation concludes with practical recommendations for selecting appropriate texts to promote reading motivation.

Dr. Isabell Eva Baumann is a researcher in the field of Digital Education & Research at the University of Luxembourg's Center for Educational Testing (LUCET). With a background in German literature studies, she is an associate member of the Institute for German Language, Literature and Interculturality. Her research focuses on innovative teaching scenarios for secondary schools, with a particular emphasis on digital didactics and digital media. Many different methods have been mentioned so far to understand and cope with traumatic experiences. This practically oriented seminar includes the evidence-based techniques and strategies for dealing with trauma and stress. It will cover the topics of how to approach a client by indicating crucial aspects of the first session. Additionally, the core part of the lecture is to learn the application of several coping strategies by doing practical exercises. Simulation modeling can be done using three paradigms: discrete, agent or continuous simulation. Systematic Research Reviews (SCIE)

CONTENT

When SCIE was established, its initial tasks included the development of systematic review guidance appropriate for social care. SCIE's reports indicate the kinds of knowledge that should be included and a framework for assessing the quality of different kinds of knowledge, a general-overview of the role of systematic reviews in improving social care and ways of synthesising studies whose findings are mainly qualitative. Most recently, SCIE has provided a worked example of the systematic synthesis of qualitative studies.

Silvia Domeniconi Pfister is a lecturer and project manager at the Lucerne University of Applied Sciences and Arts – Social Work at the Institute for Social Work and Law. She teaches and researches in the topics "Theories and Methods of Social Work", "Social Diagnostics," "Digitalization in Social Work." Project Supply Chain – The Analysis and Risk Management

CONTENT

The course describes the general characteristics of modern strategies allowing for overcoming catastrophes of project supply chains in order to systematize the knowledge. Moreover, a proprietary model has been proposed, which, also within such strategies, can be used in various types of chains in the event of disasters. Such an approach, despite strenuous attempts, has not been found in the literature on the subject. This model can be considered a useful tool, used in the area of risk management in the project supply chain, not only of Polish, but also of foreign companies. The work uses a critical analysis of the literature as well as scientific reflection and the MATLAB program environment.

Dr. Marcin Halicki, an Assistant Professor at the University of Rzeszów (Poland), holds a Ph.D. in Economics (Poznań University of Economics), is an accounting specialist. He studied Business at the Poznań University of Economics (Poznań), conducted scientific research at HSBI as a Postdoc and at Lakehead University (Canada) as a Visiting Professor. He received a German scholarship "(InWEnt)" and also studied at HSBI. He finished the training for portfolio managers.


